### **Building a Strong Foundation for the Future**

Since 2008, you have made it possible for Hospice Help Foundation (HHF) to bring urgent relief to hospice patients and their families in their most vulnerable moments. Together, we've provided over \$500,000 in financial assistance to more than 900 patients across New England and beyond. Every gift has translated into warmth, dignity, and peace of mind.

This past year, the need for our assistance rose sharply. We invested in strengthening our organization so we can serve even more patients in the years ahead. With grant funding and your support, we implemented our strategic plan, added vital staff, and laid the groundwork for new fundraising initiatives.

Your generosity has allowed us to aid well over a hundred patients this year, covering rent to prevent eviction, paying overdue utility bills to keep people safe, and making final wishes come true.

Cuts to federal programs like LIHEAP (Low-Income Heating Assistance Program), TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families), and Meals on Wheels will place even greater strain on families in hospice care. With a growing base of committed donors, we are a safety net for hospice patients who have nowhere else to turn.

None of this would be possible without you. Thank you for believing in this mission and for helping us not only to meet today's needs, but to grow into a future where every hospice patient can live their final days with comfort and dignity.


## **Hospice Help Foundation**

## 2025 AT A GLANCE

So far this year you've made a difference to low-income hospice patients in over twenty states, ranging in age from just two years old to over ninety. Your contributions helped improve the lives of patients throughout New England and beyond. In 2025, thanks to you, we helped patients in Kentucky, Nebraska, and Washington, DC, for the first time.

The average amount of the awards you made possible was \$480. Support for patients this year has ranged from as little as \$25 to as much as \$1500 in extreme circumstances of need. Here's a breakdown of how your support aided patients and their families in the first eight months of the year:

Hospice staff submit applications on behalf of their patients for help funding essential items that will have a direct impact on patients' comfort and well-being that they couldn't otherwise afford and that are not covered by insurance. HHF donors help relieve patients from the stress of financial hardship so they can focus on living every remaining day to the fullest.
